POSITION: Broader Impacts and Outreach Fellowship

SITE: MSU's Kellogg Biological Station (near Battle Creek, 70 miles from East Lansing)

NUMBER OF POSITIONS: Dependent on the project proposals

DURATION: Spring Semester: January 13 – May 2, 2025 (16 weeks), 10 hours per week

APPLICATION DUE: Application review begins October 15, 2024

DESCRIPTION: The Broader Impacts and Outreach Fellowship is designed to support your efforts in engaging a specific audience with activities related to your scientific research. This could include local organizations, undergraduate students, the general public, or farmers. You should explain which aspects of your science are important for non-scientists to understand and why. This is a fantastic opportunity to communicate complex scientific concepts to a broader audience and positively impact society.

If you need help brainstorming ideas or have questions, please contact Misty Klotz and Sarah Roy before submitting your proposal. We can help you build it.

PROPOSAL: Your proposal should concisely summarize your research and idea for the Broader Impacts and Outreach Fellowship. Also, clearly state your intended audience, required resources, a detailed work plan for 160 hours of funding, project objectives, and deliverables. This proposal should be similar to a grant proposal.

TASKS INCLUDE:

- Your project outline with clear objectives and deadlines
- Scheduled meetings to review and support your project
- During or soon after the fellowship, create a one-page report of your accomplishments and a blog post or set of social media posts.

QUALIFICATIONS: Graduate or master's students who have completed at least one year of graduate work at MSU are eligible to apply. The ideal candidate should possess excellent written and verbal communication skills, the ability to work independently, strong organizational skills, and creativity.

SALARY: The Broader Impacts and Outreach Fellow will receive \$7,250 paid at the beginning of the term to cover the stipend. The fellowship funding will be directly deposited into your student account. Please note that the IRS and the Michigan Treasury consider graduate fellowships as taxable income, and your fellowship award will be reported on a 1098-T form. Taxes will not be withheld from the fellowship. For more information, please see
