We are currently updating the Michigan program to launch its second year at the W.K. Kellogg Biological Station (KBS) starting summer 2026.

We have funding from a grant to support a Research Assistant (RA) in spring 2026 to revise program materials. This position will be co-supervised by Jackie Gerson, an adjunct faculty member, and Misty Klotz, the education and outreach coordinator at KBS. In line with university RA expectations, this role requires 20 hours per week. Responsibilities will include managing logistical and organizational tasks as we develop the program at MSU and incorporate the RA's experiences and expertise.

Specific tasks will vary throughout the semester and will include:

- 1. Advertising the GALS program to students and leaders
- 2. Maintaining GALS Michigan website and social media
- 3. Communicating with students, parents, leaders, and speakers
- 4. Assembling trip-specific gear
- 5. Updating program materials
- 6. Compiling participant paperwork and trip logistic paperwork

Qualifications: Graduate students who have completed at least one year of graduate study at MSU are eligible to apply. We are looking for a highly detail-oriented candidate who possesses excellent interpersonal and communication skills and has a proven ability to work collaboratively as part of a team.

Applicants should demonstrate genuine enthusiasm and commitment to GALS's mission.

Please note: There will be an opportunity to continue this work through a summer fellowship. We will soon seek graduate student volunteers to help with additional aspects of the GALS program development, and we will also recruit summer trip leaders.
