Kellogg Bird Sanctuary buildings close for the winter season, trails remain open

Augusta, Mich. - On Thursday, November 27, 2014 the Kellogg Bird Sanctuary Resource Center gift shop will be closing for the winter season. Although the building will be closed, staff will be on the grounds daily and the trails will remain open.

Visitors are welcome to enjoy the Sanctuary's 3+ miles of trails and waterfowl on Wintergreen Lake from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. during the winter months. Admission is always free to members and an honesty admission box is available at the entrance for non-members. Admission is \$5/adults, \$4 for seniors 62+ and college students, \$3 children ages 2-17, and children under 2 are free. Corn to feed the waterfowl will be available for purchase at the trail entrance. Per MSU policy, no outside food is allowed in to be given to the birds. Sanctuary administration staff will be available Monday-Friday to answer phone calls at (269) 671-2510 and emails at birdsanctuary@kbs.msu.edu.
